# Ceilidh Dance

A cèilidh is a traditional Scottish or Irish social gathering. In its most basic form, it simply means a social visit. In contemporary usage, it usually involves playing Gaelic folk music and dancing, either at a house party or a larger concert at a social hall or other community gathering place.

Cèilidh music may be provided by an assortment of instruments including fiddle, flute, tin whistle, accordion, bodhrán, hammered dulcimer and in more recent times also drums, guitar, mandolin, bouzouki and electric bass guitar.

The music is cheerful and lively, consisting in Ireland mainly of jigs, reels, hornpipes, polkas, slip-jigs and waltzes, with Scotland adding strathspeys, and England adding regional forms such as the northeastern rant.

The basic steps can be learned easily; a short instructional session is often provided for new dancers before the start of the dance itself.

Dancing at Cèilidhs is usually in the form of Cèilidh dances, set dances or couple dances. A "Set" consists of four to eight couples, with each pair of couples facing another in a square or rectangular formation. Each couple exchanges position with the facing couple, and also facing couples exchange partners, while all the time keeping in step with the beat of the music.

However, about half of the dances in the modern Scots Cèilidh are couples' dances performed in a ring. These can be performed by fixed couples or in the more sociable "progressive" manner, with the lady moving to the next gentleman in the ring at or near the end of each repetition of the steps.

Some of the dances are named after famous regiments, historical battles and events, others after items of daily rural life. The "Gay Gordons", "Siege of Ennis", "The Walls of Limerick" and "The Stack of Barley" are popular.

tapping recognisable standards to the more obscure songs. With Gary on the acoustic bass, Justin on the mandolin, Kris on the guitar and Steve on the banjo this is surely a night not to be missed.

This concert comes with the said news the genre from the Old Timey music of of Kris heading back to his 'Old Home Place' so this may well be your last chance to see the Port Hillbillies in their current form.


Perform material you know – we don't expect perfection but you'll always come across better if you really know your stuff. However, if you are a

In a largely male dominated musical genre, to see a full jazz big band on stage with a woman in each section is one thing. To find a full big band of women is stunning. Full sections of trombone, trumpet, sax and rhythm, played with class and style. Add two powerhouse vocalists and you'll be blown away!

The All Girl Big Band, formed in January 2016, was brought about after a conversation between Lana Law and Kate Taylor at the 'Doug and Doug' Tribute Concert.

It had us wondering if we could actually get a big band together here in Christchurch consisting of only female musicians. It didn't take long between us to realise that in fact we could name virtually a full 17 piece big band of Christchurch female musicians. What was considered a crazy, out of the box idea finally became reality.

In January we contacted those who we thought

would be interested. Out of the creative influence and the Musical Direction of Lana Law, and stunning vocals of ARA vocal tutor Kate Taylor, the All Girl Big Band emerged. The All Girl Big Band debuted at In the Loop at the Court Theatre as part of their 'Hidden Artists' segment. Since then they have had stunning success with gigs for Jazz After Work, the Swingtown Rebels and our upcoming Tribute to Natalie Cole in the 2016 Big Band Festival.

The band consists of an array of talented musicians – the majority are professional musicians or music teachers in Christchurch. We are lucky enough to have a wide range of ages too, from high school student age to our most mature member at 77, who took up the trombone in her late 40's!

We see ourselves as a unique band here in Christchurch and are very excited to play for you all – Watch this space

Four of New Zealand's busiest songwriters offer an entertaining evening of wordplay, musical and otherwise, as they join forces to perform their favourite original songs.



Best known for his Hot Club Sandwich trio and now under his own name. Andrew London's reputation stands mostly on his satirical and comedic songs, which lampoon many of NZ society's obsessions, foibles and taboos. Songs like Let's Talk About Me, Country's Buggered and Speed up at the overtaking lane have elicited chuckles of recognition from audiences at festival performances from Norfolk Island to Saudi Arabia, and have contributed to a Correspondence School English Syllabus, National Radio's 'Greatest Song Ever Written', several feature films, and over a dozen recorded albums, two of which have received 4-star reviews from Downbeat USA, the World's longest standing and most widely read jazz magazine.

Rob Joass is well known to many music fans throughout New Zealand through his work with Hobnail, The Shot Band, The Hard Core Troubadours and Too Many Chiefs. He writes compulsively, tours incessantly, teaches guitar, produces albums, and can be found behind a mixing desk live and in the studio when time allows. His songs have been covered by artists both in NZ and abroad, and he is a 3 time finalist at the NZ Music Awards. Hobnail are currently working on their 7th album, and Rob is also planning a solo album for 2018. No rest in sight then, and he wouldn't have it any other way

Wayne Mason, is known and loved from his time with Rocking Horse, the Fourmyula, & the Warratahs. He currently works with five different touring line ups. Honoured for having written the song of the millennium 'Nature', he has 16 albums to his name with bands along the way, 4 of which are from his own band. His most recent *Wait there's more* is a warm boogie piano driven album where Wayne mixes his own tunes with the likes of Fats Domino and he is currently working on a 'best of' which will pull together his favourite tunes from the last 50 years and adds a couple that are 'new love's.

Laura Collins, tours with her band the Back Porch Blues Band. She likes to move between ballsy blues and beautiful ballads and hand out the banter in between. She's got four albums to her name, the latest 'Live at VK's' captures the live grit and joyous energy of her blues band out with an audience. She brings the oestrogen to this line-up, and that could mean 'sorting the blokes out' or 'adding a little sugar', depending on the given moment.

Too Many Chiefs will be bringing tunes from their recent release So many tracks among others, expect a celebration of song writing, more wit than you can poke a stick at and a great night out.
